CONFERENCE FACULTY

Karen Lake, RN, MSN, NP has taught at MSU for more than 15 years through the College of Nursing. Her research focuses on coping, stress and maternal depression.

Denise Saint-Arnault, RN, PhD is an Associate Professor in the MSU College of Nursing. An NIH-funded investigator, her research focuses on cultural influences, women's health and mental health issues.

Ved Gossain, MD is the Swartz Professor in the Department of Medicine. He is Chief of the Division of Endocrinology and maintains an active practice. Dr. Gossain's research interests include diabetes, obesity, thyroid disorders, and growth hormone disorders.

Roshni Kulkarni, MD is a Professor in the Department of Pediatrics and Human Development. She has served as Director of the CDC Division of Blood Disorders in the National Center on Birth Defects and Developmental Disabilities.

Gina Chacon, MD is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Medicine in the Division of General Internal Medicine. Her research is in immune-mediated skin disorders including pemphigus.

MaryAnn Tran, MD is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Medicine, Division of Infectious Diseases. She maintains an active inpatient and outpatient practice. Her research focuses on drug-resistance.
