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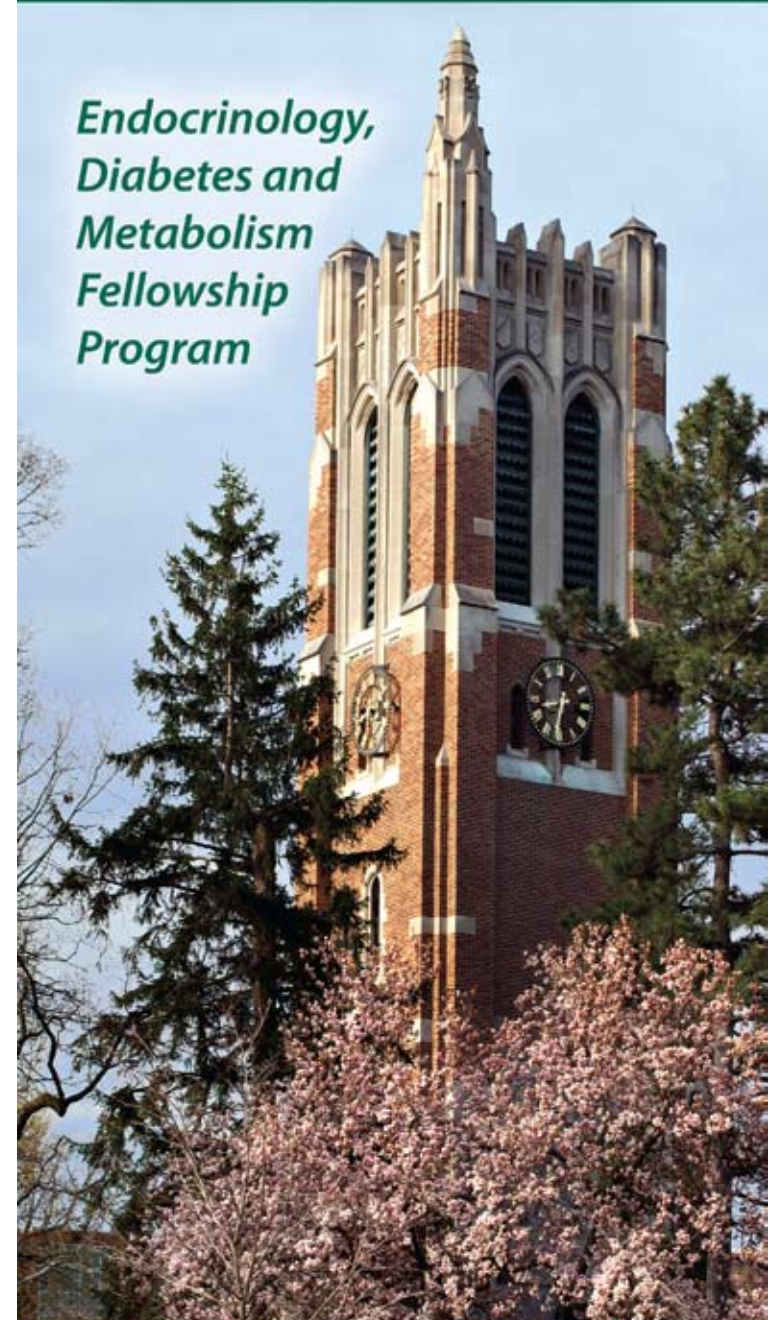

SPARROW HOSPITAL:
A HIDDEN GEM

- Our teaching hospital partner, Sparrow Hospital, is a 700-bed acute care center that offers state of the art technology and recent facility renovations.
- The Sparrow Regional Diabetes Center provides services for people with diabetes and their families. This program was established in 1969 and certified by the Michigan Department of Community Health in 1995. The diabetes center was awarded full recognition by the American Diabetes Association in 1997.
- The Pediatric Endocrinology staff provides comprehensive services for children in the mid-Michigan area. The pediatric program was established in 2001 and certified by the Michigan Department of Community Health in 2003.
- Sparrow Heart Center offers state-of-the art cardiology and cardiovascular intervention as well as cutting-edge technology and equipment.

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The Endocrinology and Metabolism Fellowship available at Michigan State University offers a 2-year training program leading to board eligibility in Endocrinology and Metabolism.

- During the first year, fellows are predominately involved in the care of patients but will have time, and are expected, to develop a research project.
- In the second year, fellows will have less clinical responsibility and are expected to complete a research project under the supervision of one of the faculty members.
- Outpatient clinical activities are located at the Michigan State University Clinical Center and the Sparrow Regional Diabetes Center.
- Most inpatient consultations come from Sparrow Hospital and occasionally from the St. Lawrence campus of Sparrow Hospital and Ingham Regional Medical Center.
- The Fellowship provides ample opportunities for clinical research. Basic science research projects may also be developed in collaboration with basic science faculty at Michigan State University.
- This program is flexible and can be modified to fulfill the needs of those who expect to function as clinician educators and those who intend to pursue careers in clinical and/or basic endocrine research.
- The teaching environment and education experiences for trainees will equip them to become strong clinicians, educators and investigators.

- Michigan State University was founded in 1855 as the nation's premier land grant university. - Applicants for fellowship must successfully complete an Internal Medicine residency program in the United State before applying for endocrinology fellowship.
